Results from March 9th Leadership Retreat; Considering a Simplified Leadership Structure

Last Saturday, March 9th, a number of leaders and church members joined together to discuss how effectively our current organizational structure is working and whether we should consider a Simplified Leadership Structure. We did a SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) analysis which helped us ask questions such as:

"How is our current structure helping or hindering us in fulfilling our mission?" Some of the answers we discerned were:

Positives of our current structure:

- (1) The current structure is full of dedicated and creative people
- (2) Current leaders understand the current structure.
- (3) We are able to get needed work done most of the time

Negatives our of current structure:

- (1) Work is repeated and at times is inefficient (e.g. multiple meetings on the same topics).
- (2) Leaders are burned out/not enough persons to lead
- (3) It can be slow to move when decisions need to be made/decisions not clearly communicated to congregation

We also asked "How could a simplified structure help or hinder us in fulfilling our mission?"

Positives of a proposed structure:

- (1) Fewer meetings, less repetition
- (2) More time to devote to 'becoming living disciples'
- (3) Centralized vision and decision making/process could move more quickly

Negatives:

- (1) Discomfort of change
- (2) Potential to lose productivity short term as a new system is implemented
- (3) Persons could feel that they have lost their power or their purpose

After spending the morning on this analysis, those in attendance came to consensus that we should consider a Simplified Leadership Structure. We will continue to have meetings to flesh out what that structure should look like. The plan is to bring a recommendation to the whole congregation for a vote in the next 3-6 months. In order for Good Shepherd to change our current structure, that vote would need to happen at a Church/Charge Conference (either the annual fall meeting or a called Church Conference).

Our next meeting which will be focused on discerning how the work of Trustees/Building Maintenance would be cared for in a Simplified Structure will be on March 23 at 8:00 a.m. ahead of the Trustee Clean-Up Day. All are welcome.

Dear Church Family,

As you may know, delegates from around the United Methodist Church will be gathering from April 23-May 3 for General Conference in Raleigh, NC. Perhaps you have been wondering what will be discussed and what changes may be proposed. You no doubt have heard that the UMC, like much of society, has had challenges regarding differing opinions about a whole host of things including the role of LGBTQ persons in the life and ministry of our churches.

Rev. Adam Hamilton, pastor of Resurrection UMC in Leawood, KS, spent time this week talking about what the role of General Conference is, who will be there and what are the areas of legislation that will be under consideration. Because the General Conference is the voice of the UMC and changes to our polity can only be made by the General Conference, it is important for all of us to be praying for this gathering and staying up to date on what is happening as delegates engage in holy conferencing together.

I believe that it will help your understanding of this important time ahead in the United Methodist Church. The Mary Wattenford Scholarship Application--2024

The Mary Wattenford Scholarship was established in 2003 as the Good Shepherd Continuing Education Scholarship. It was established as a service-based scholarship to award the youth of Good Shepherd for their acts of service to the church, community, and most of all to God. Scholarships are awarded to high school seniors who plan to go on to college or some other form of higher education. First-year college students who were not previously awarded this scholarship and are planning to continue their higher education are also eligible to apply. The scholarship fund was named to honor Mary Wattenford, a dear member of Good Shepherd Church who passed away in July 2004. Applicants are judged on their responses to the questions asked below, their letters of recommendation, and their interviews with the Scholarship Selection Committee. The scholarship committee is looking for persons with sound Christian character who practice discipleship in daily life and are able to articulate their faith to others.

Please read these guidelines for eligibility. The applicant must be:

- a 2024 graduating high school senior
- or a first-year college student who was not previously awarded this scholarship and is planning to continue their higher education
- an active participant at Good Shepherd United Methodist Church
- actively involved in some form of ministry for at least one year prior to making application for this award.

To apply, please submit the following required materials digitally in one complete application package:

- 1. The attached cover sheet that includes your complete name, mailing address, e-mail address, high school or institution of higher learning you are currently attending, telephone number(s), and the year you were confirmed or became a member of Good Shepherd UMC (if applicable), and your choice of interview dates.
- 2. A separate essay which addresses the following questions:
 - 1. How have you actively participated at Good Shepherd and how long you have been in each activity?
 - 2. How has your participation in the ministries of GSUMC helped you grow as a disciple of Christ?
 - 3. What gifts has God given you and how do you use them, either through the church or in other areas?
 - 4. Write about a personal situation or time when you had to rely on your faith in God.
 - 5. What are your education and career goals?
 - 6. What is your favorite Bible story or verse and why?
- **3.** Three letters of reference from people who know you, your character, or your practice of Christian discipleship. One reference must be from a current or former teacher and one must be from a member of Good Shepherd UMC. The third reference can be from a coach, scout leader, co-worker, friend, classmate, or neighbor.
- 4. In addition to submitting this application, you will be asked to meet with the Scholarship Selection Committee for an interview which will last approximately 20 minutes.

Please email your application and scanned letters of reference to Lucy Snell, Ijsnell@comcast.net no later than Wednesday, April 17, 2024. Please clearly label as Mary Wattenford Scholarship Application. Only complete applications will be considered.
